

## **Joint Declaration signed in San Bernardino of the North Triangle of Central America and Mexico**

- **A consultative group formed by the consulates of El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Mexico is formed in San Bernardino, California.**
- **The firm highlights the feelings of friendship and solidarity that are shared among Latin American countries.**

**The Consul General in Los Angeles of El Salvador, María Mercedes López Peña, the Consul in San Bernardino of Guatemala, Billy Adolfo José Muñoz Miranda, and the Consul General of Mexico in San Bernardino, Salomón Rosas, signed today the Jointly Declaration formalizing the consultation and collaboration group composed of the consulates of the three countries based in Los Angeles and San Bernardino, California (Northern Triangle of Central America and Mexico, TRICAMEX).**

During the event, held at the Consulate of Mexico in San Bernardino, the consuls of the three countries endorsed the commitment signed in the past by the **Ministry of Foreign Affairs and its counterparts in El Salvador and Guatemala. Honduras was unable to attend due to Agenda issues.**

In the intervention of the Consul of Mexico in San Bernardino, the speaker highlighted his Foreign Affairs Minister Luis Videgaray during his speech in Mexico City on the new position on Foreign Policy, referring to the principles with which Mexico will attend this new stage: National sovereignty, respect for Rule of law, constructive and purposeful vision, integration of North America and integral negotiation.

The event was attended by around 30 guests, including officials from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Office, County Social Services Department (DPSS), California Highway Patrol (CHP), proxies of Representatives Mark Takano (D-Riverside), Norma Torres (D-San Bernardino-Los Angeles) and Pete Aguilar (D-San Bernardino), Senator Connie Leyva (D-San Bernardino) D-Coachella), Congresswoman Eloise Reyes (D-San Bernardino) as honorary witnesses to the signing of this Joint Declaration.

This Representation will inform in due time on the actions that are made in alliance with the Consulates that conform TRICAMEX, product of this agreement.

Consultation mechanisms are useful tools for dialogue with local authorities, businessmen, academics, civil society organizations and all those involved in the care of migrant communities. They also create synergies in education, health, legal counseling and preventive protection, as well as disseminating information relevant to our population in this country.
